🎵Scripture Reading: **Isaiah 36:1, 20; 39:1-2**

1 In the fourteenth year of King Hezekiah's reign, Sennacherib king of Assyria attacked all the fortified cities of Judah and captured them.

20 Who of all the gods of these countries has been able to save his land from me? How then can the LORD deliver Jerusalem from my hand?

Isaiah 39:1-2

1 At that time Marduk-Baladan son of Baladan king of Babylon sent Hezekiah letters and a gift, because he had heard of his illness and recovery.

2 Hezekiah received the envoys gladly and showed them what was in his storehouses—the silver, the gold, the spices, the fine olive oil—his entire armory and everything found among his treasures. There was nothing in his palace or in all his kingdom that Hezekiah did not show them.

✎Sermon: Three Battles in Life - Pastor Dong

Through this battle, God shows us that there are three kinds of battles we must face in life:

The battle to survive, the battle of faith, and the battle to fear and honor God.

These are also: The battle between life and death, the battle to trust only in God, and the battle to keep honoring God.

Let's pray that God would lift up our wisdom and understanding, so that we can become winners in life—bringing glory to God and blessing to others!

Isaiah 36:4-21 The field commander said to them, "Tell Hezekiah: 'This is what the great king, the king of Assyria, says: On what are you basing this confidence of yours?'"

5 You say you have counsel and might for war—but you speak only empty words. On whom are you depending, that you rebel against me?

6 Look, I know you are depending on Egypt, that splintered reed of a staff, which pierces the hand of anyone who leans on it! Such is Pharaoh king of Egypt to all who depend on him.

7 But if you say to me, "We are depending on the Lord our God"—isn't he the one whose high places and altars Hezekiah removed, saying to Judah and Jerusalem, "You must worship before this altar?"

8 "Come now, make a bargain with my master, the king of Assyria: I will give you two thousand horses—if you can put riders on them!"

9 How then can you repulse one officer of the least of my master's officials, even though you are depending on Egypt for chariots and horsemen?

10 Furthermore, have I come to attack and destroy this land without the Lord? The Lord himself told me to march against this country and destroy it."

11 Then Eliakim, Shebna and Joah said to the field commander, "Please speak to your servants in

Aramaic, since we understand it. Don't speak to us in Hebrew in the hearing of the people on the wall."

12 But the commander replied, "Was it only to your master and you that my master sent me to say these things, and not to the people sitting on the wall—who, like you, will have to eat their own excrement and drink their own urine?"

13 Then the commander stood and called out in Hebrew, "Hear the words of the great king, the king of Assyria!"

14 This is what the king says: Do not let Hezekiah deceive you. He cannot deliver you!

15 Do not let Hezekiah persuade you to trust in the Lord when he says, 'The Lord will surely deliver us; this city will not be given into the hand of the king of Assyria.'

16 Do not listen to Hezekiah. This is what the king of Assyria says: Make peace with me and come out to me. Then each of you will eat fruit from your own vine and fig tree and drink water from your own cistern, **17** until I come and take you to a land like your own—a land of grain and new wine, a land of bread and vineyards.

18 Do not let Hezekiah mislead you when he says, 'The Lord will deliver us.' Have the gods of any nations ever delivered their lands from the hand of the king of Assyria?

19 Where are the gods of Hamath and Arpad? Where are the gods of Sepharvaim? Have they rescued Samaria from my hand?

20 Who of all the gods of these countries has been able to save their lands from me? How then can the Lord deliver Jerusalem from my hand?"

21 But the people remained silent and said nothing in reply, because the king had commanded, "Do not answer him."

Isaiah 37:1 When King Hezekiah heard this, he tore his clothes and put on sackcloth and went into the temple of the Lord.

Isaiah 37:9-13 Now Sennacherib received a report that Tirhakah, the king of Cush, was marching out to fight him. When he heard it, he sent messengers to Hezekiah with this message:

10 "Say to Hezekiah king of Judah: Do not let the god you depend on deceive you when he says, 'Jerusalem will not be given into the hands of the king of Assyria.'

11 Surely you have heard what the kings of Assyria have done to all the countries, destroying them completely. And will you be delivered?

12 Did the gods of the nations that were destroyed by my ancestors deliver them—the gods of Gozan, Haran, Rezeph, and the people of Eden who were in Tel Assar?

13 Where is the king of Hamath, or the king of Arpad? Where is the king of Lachish, or the king of Seleph, or the king of the cities of the Sea?"

Isaiah 37:15-20 And Hezekiah prayed to the Lord:

16 “Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, enthroned between the cherubim, you alone are God over all the kingdoms of the earth. You have made heaven and earth.

17 Give ear, Lord, and hear; open your eyes, Lord, and see; listen to all the words Sennacherib has sent to ridicule the living God.

18 “It is true, Lord, that the kings of Assyria have laid waste all these peoples and their lands.

19 They have thrown their gods into the fire and destroyed them, for they were not gods but only wood and stone, fashioned by human hands.

20 Now, Lord our God, deliver us from his hand, so that all the kingdoms of the earth may know that you, Lord, are the only God.”

Isaiah 37:26 Have you not heard? Long ago I ordained it. In days of old I planned it; now I have brought it to pass, that you have turned fortified cities into piles of stone

Isaiah 37:29 Because you rage against me and because your insolence has reached my ears, I will put my hook in your nose and my bit in your mouth, and I will make you return by the way you came.

Isaiah 37:36-38 Then the angel of the Lord went out and put to death a hundred and eighty-five thousand in the Assyrian camp. When the people got up the next morning—there were all the dead bodies!

37 So Sennacherib king of Assyria broke camp and withdrew. He returned to Nineveh and stayed there.

38 One day, while he was worshiping in the temple of his god Nisrok, his sons Adrammelek and Sharezer killed him with the sword, and they escaped to the land of Ararat. And Esarhaddon his son succeeded him as king.

Isaiah 38:1-3 In those days Hezekiah became ill and was at the point of death. The prophet Isaiah son of Amoz went to him and said, “This is what the Lord says: Put your house in order, because you are going to die; you will not recover.”

2 Hezekiah turned his face to the wall and prayed to the Lord,

3 “Remember, Lord, how I have walked before you faithfully and with wholehearted devotion and have done what is good in your eyes.” And Hezekiah wept bitterly.

Isaiah 39:1-8 At that time Marduk-Baladan son of Baladan king of Babylon sent Hezekiah letters and a gift, because he had heard of his illness and recovery.

2 Hezekiah received the envoys gladly and showed them what was in his storehouses—the silver, the gold, the spices, the fine olive oil—his entire armory and everything found among his treasures. There was nothing in his palace or in all his kingdom that Hezekiah did not show them.

3 Then Isaiah the prophet went to King Hezekiah and asked, “What did those men say, and where did they come from?”

“From a distant land,” Hezekiah replied. “They came to me from Babylon.”

4 The prophet asked, “What did they see in your palace?”

“They saw everything in my palace,” Hezekiah said. “There is nothing among my treasures that I did not show them.”

5 Then Isaiah said to Hezekiah, “Hear the word of the Lord Almighty:

6 The time will surely come when everything in your palace, and all that your predecessors have stored up until this day, will be carried off to Babylon. Nothing will be left, says the Lord.

7 And some of your descendants, your own flesh and blood who will be born to you, will be taken away, and they will become eunuchs in the palace of the king of Babylon.”

8 “The word of the Lord you have spoken is good,” Hezekiah replied. For he thought, “There will be peace and security in my lifetime.”

Deuteronomy 30:19–20 This day I call the heavens and the earth as witnesses against you that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Now choose life, so that you and your children may live **20** and that you may love the Lord your God, listen to his voice, and hold fast to him. For the Lord is your life, and he will give you many years in the land he swore to give to your fathers, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

I. The Battle to Survive (Deuteronomy 30:19–20)

The powerful army of Assyria, with 185,000 soldiers, was only 50 kilometers from Jerusalem. Could Hezekiah survive this?

Hezekiah reminds us that our own strength is often too small.

But there's a greater kind of battle—one that takes place on a higher level—that determines who wins in real life.

II. The Battle to Trust God Alone (Isaiah 37:15–20; 36:4,7–10,15,18,20; 37:1,10–11)

King Hezekiah firmly believed what Moses said in **Deuteronomy 30:19-20**.

Hezekiah believed that God is the one true God, the Creator of everything, and the supreme ruler of all things. He is invincible, as stated in **Isaiah 37:16**.

Hezekiah was not shaken by anything or anyone. He prayed and called out to God with unwavering faith, relying solely on Him.

The result was beyond human logic—miraculously, they achieved a great victory!

III. The Battle to Keep Fearing and Honoring God (Isaiah 37:26; Deuteronomy 30:20; Isaiah 37:29, 36-38; 36:5; 38:1-3; 39:1-8)

Continue to persist in loving God, obeying His commands, honoring God in all things, and relying solely on Him.

This is the battle of life and death, blessings and curses, as Moses taught—Deuteronomy 30:20.

Hezekiah lost the battle on the highest spiritual level. He fell into the depths of selfishness, leading his nation toward destruction!

The most important battlefield in our lives is the third level: the battle to keep fearing and honoring God.

If we stop loving God, listening to Him, and relying on Him, we will lose in every other battle.

But if we keep honoring God in all things, we will win completely—until the day we see Him face to face!

Having peace and wealth on the outside doesn't mean there's no battle.

In fact, a life that feels stable and successful may mean we are standing in the middle of the biggest battle—the third-level battle.

King Hezekiah won the second-level battle because he prayed without giving up.

If we keep praying like that, we can also keep winning the third-level battle—by holding on to loving God, listening to Him, and trusting Him, even when everything seems to be going well.

Let's ask God to help us turn our desperate, passionate prayers into a daily habit.
